Davison Township Election Updates

The next election for Davison Township voters is the Presidential Primary scheduled for February 27, 2024. For the first time voters in Davison Township will have the option of 9 days of early in-person voting prior to the election. With approval of the township board of trustees consolidated early voting will take place at the Davison Township Hall at 1280 N. Irish Road at the following dates and times:

Saturday, February 17 from 10am-6pm

Sunday, February 18 from 10am-6pm

Monday, February 19 from 8am-4pm

Tuesday, February 20 from 8am-4pm

Wednesday, February 21 from 8am-4pm

Thursday, February 22 from 8am-4pm

Friday, February 23 from 8am-4pm

Saturday, February 24 from 10am-6pm

Sunday, February 25 from 10am-6pm

Any registered voter from <u>any</u> of Davison Township's nine precincts can in-person vote at the early voting site. Absentee voters will receive their ballot in the mail prior to the election and can return them via mail or put them in the Davison Township drop-box in front of the Township building on Irish Road. The box is monitored by a high-definition camera with recording in the township police station. Any voter who would like to get on the Permanent Absentee Voter List can stop the Clerk's office during normal business hours to make that request.

Davison Township is also soliciting people to work as poll workers. With the additional voting opportunities during elections the need for poll workers is mounting. Poll workers will be paid to attend a 3-hour Genesee County Clerk certified class in order to be a qualified poll worker. To balance out precincts with workers from both major political parties, there is a special need for registered Democrats to become poll workers in Davison Township. Furthermore, poll workers are paid to work election days. Contact Brenda Tong in the Clerk's office to start the process. This is a great way to get involved in the political process and help to ensure elections in Michigan are fair, open, and the results are accurate.
